What We Do

Thunderwing:

- brings together organizations supporting a individual/family and encourages them to work as a team
- works to resolve system issues that prevent individuals/families from reaching their goals

How We Work

- Referrals are brought to a committee of government and community agencies called the Hub.
- The Hub reviews the individual/family goals to address system and policy barriers.
- A team is developed and works together to support the individual/family in reaching their goals.
- Individuals/families lead the process and are equal members of the support team.

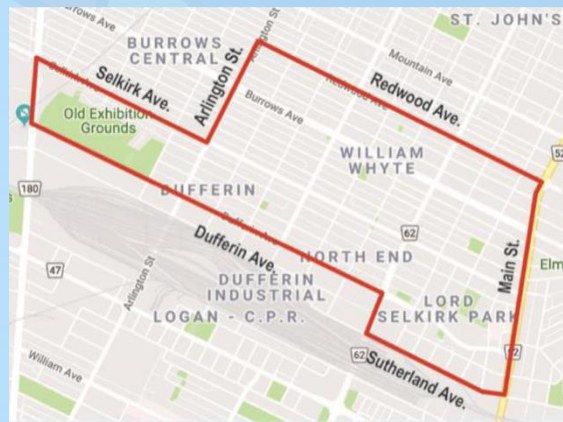
Who We Work With

- are involved with more than one system and experiencing barriers
- or
- are NOT connected to any services and could benefit from some support

How Do I Participate

If you are interested in participating in this project, talk to a staff member of an agency you are connected to. Any agency can refer you to the project.

How Do I Refer

You can refer an individual/family by contacting project staff (contact info on back). Before referring consider:

- Are there increasing safety concerns?
- Is the individual/family involved in more than one system?
- Are there barriers within these systems that are getting in the way of the individual/family's success?
- Could the individual/family benefit from systems/services working together?
- Have you and your agency tried to support the individual/family and work through barriers to the best of your ability?
